

About Tiffany...


Tiffany Jewell is a Black biracial writer, twin, first generation American, cisgender woman, an antiracist educator and consultant, and a mama. She spends her time baking bread and macarons, building LEGOS, watching British detective shows, and dreaming up how she can dismantle white supremacy. Tiffany currently resides on the traditional unceded land of the Pocumtuc and the Nipmuck with her two young activists, her partner, and a turtle she's had since she was nine years old.

She is just completed her 15th year as a Montessori educator and is nearing two decades of work in schools with young folks, families, and educators. *This Book Is Anti-Racist* is her first book for children and young adults (and definitely not the last).

Waking Up

Students will engage in an interactive presentation introducing them to personal identity work. We'll build collective language around our social identities and begin to look deeply into who we are. Tiffany will share her identity work and how her understanding of who she is has changed over time. There will be time for Q&A too! (And, a writing prompt will be shared with students.)

Going Beyond the Dictionary.

Tiffany will share a short slide presentation and a working definition for racism. Students will engage in a discussion breaking the definition down and gain a deeper understanding of what racism is. They'll work together to gain awareness and analyze racism on individual and institutional levels. There will be time for a Q&A too! (A writing prompt will be shared with students.)

The History We Carry With Us

Through the use of a slide presentation and storytelling, Tiffany will share a brief history of racism and anti-racism in the United States. Knowing our history will help us to understand why racism exists and how we can become better ancestors and work together to dismantle it. Students will have a chance to add the history they know to the timeline. Tiffany will also share the process she went through with writing this section of *This Book Is Anti-Racist* and what she wishes she could have added to the chapters. There will be time for a short Q&A too! (A writing prompt will be shared with students.)

Choosing My Path*

Tiffany will share her personal path with disrupting racism and discuss with students different ways we can all respond to racism. Students will build their anti-racist toolbox and begin to create a plan on how they can and will disrupt racism (individually and as a group). We'll also talk about fatigue and self-care. There will be time for a short Q&A too! (A writing prompt will be shared with students.)

What We're Fighting For*

Tiffany will share different visions of liberation and justice with students from examples throughout history. To be able to dismantle racism and systems of oppression, we need to know what it is we are fighting for. Through the use of writing prompts and discussion, students will work on a vision for the future. We'll build definitions for solidarity and accountability and begin to create a vision statement for our shared future. There will be time for a short Q&A too!



This Book Is Anti-Racist
